- **14th Cavalry Regiment (Horse)** 1901 to 1943: Campaigns in the Philippines and on the Mexican Border.
- **14th Cavalry Group** in Europe during World War II: The Losheim Gap & bridgehead at Remagen.
- **14th Constabulary Regiment:** The occupation of Germany following World War II.
- **14th Armored Cavalry Regiment:** On the front line of NATO's most critical sector during the Cold War.
- **14th Cavalry Squadrons** (Reconnaissance, Surveillance and Target Acquisition) Sept. 2000 to date: At the forefront of the transition to a rapidly-deployable force, carrying on the tradition with their service in Iraq and Afghanistan.

- Presents crests, pins, caps and coins to wounded troopers and their families.
- Participates in memorial services and funerals of fallen troopers; presents cavalry mementos to the family.
- Our members provide support and donations for the squadrons' all-ranks social functions.
- Reunions: renew old friendships and build new ones, visit past duty stations and learn about today's army.
- Publishes a newsletter "CHARGE!" that has something of interest for all members.
